PILOT PROJECT

- The initial pilot will run from April 2021 for 6 months OR 50 participants
- At least eight areas of the UK, with a view to expanding the project nationally to reach 4000 frontline workers over the next 2 years
- 6 have completed the intervention to date and 30+ are actively engaged in the pilot project or on the waiting list

 Frontline workers who have been adversely affected as a result of working during the Covid pandemic.

WHO IS IT FOR?

WHAT DO WE OFFER

- Four free-of-charge 1 hour sessions
- Ground-based and/or mounted intervention
- Accrued fatigue and unprocessed memories of very challenging work through the pandemic are processed

OUTCOME MEASURES

- Generalized Anxiety and Depression Score (GAD)
- World Health Organisation
 Wellbeing Questionnaire short version
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder short screening tool

METHODOLOGY

- Self-referred or referred from medical practitioners
- Applications managed and screened centrally by qualified staff
- Three questionnaires completed by applicants
- Any red flags picked up and onward referral arranged
- Eligible applicants placed with nearest registered provider (HETI members)
- Questionnaires completed at end of 4 sessions, and 6 months later
- Anecdotal findings and photographic evidence collected by registered provider
